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Communiqué to 'Assessing against the Standards' workshop participants

The Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission (the Commission) is working with the Department of Health to monitor developments and advice to the aged care sector regarding the COVID-19 situation. Each day new details are provided, and we are continuing to review the current situation to determine the best course of action to support the sector.

As a result, and in line with recent advice, the Commission has decided to postpone its face-to-face 'Assessing against the Standards' workshops for both residential and home services. In the meantime, we are considering options for providing this information and education via webinars and other online options where this is possible.

The Commission will waive its 14-day refund policy for attendance cancellation for these workshops, including the \$55 administration fee, and will backdate this to workshops held from 9 March 2020 onwards.
