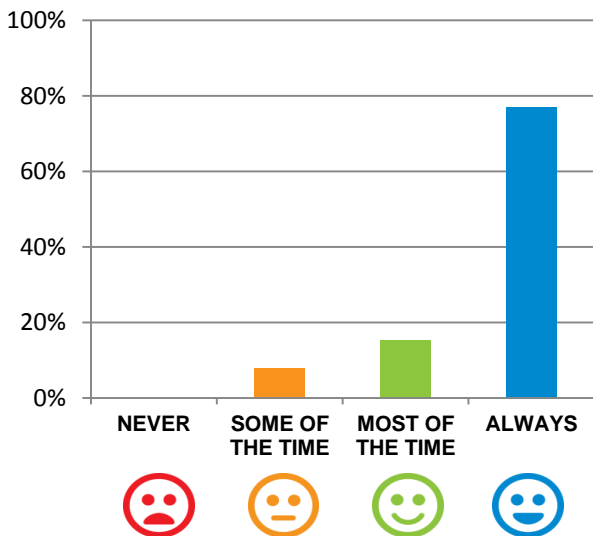

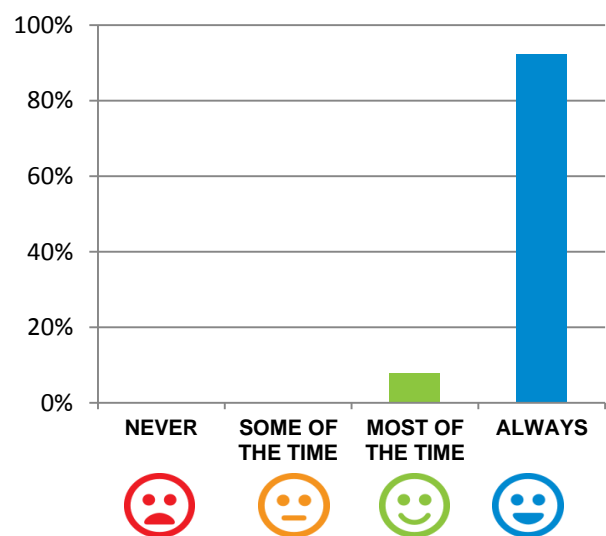

Do staff treat you with respect?



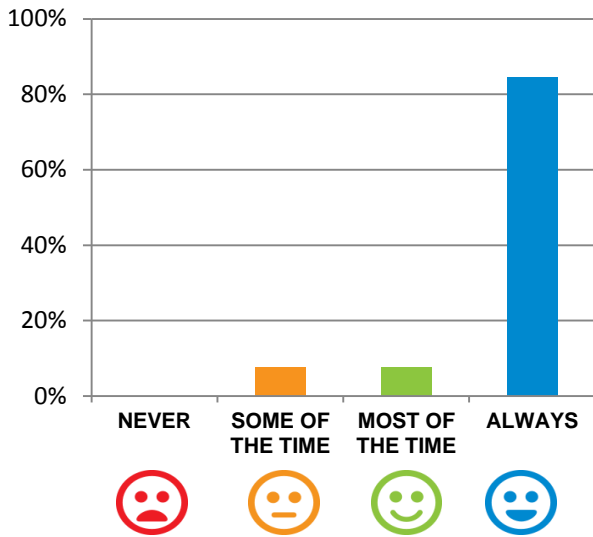
92% of responses were: most of the time or always

Do you feel safe here?



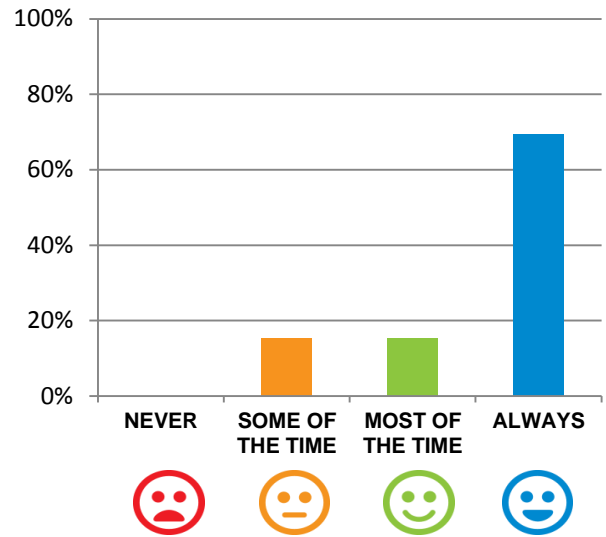
100% of responses were: most of the time or always

Do staff meet your healthcare needs?



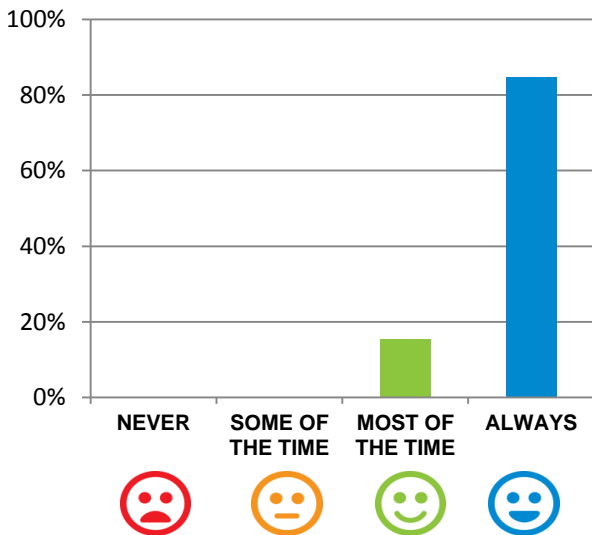
92% of responses were: most of the time or always

Do staff follow up when you raise things with them?



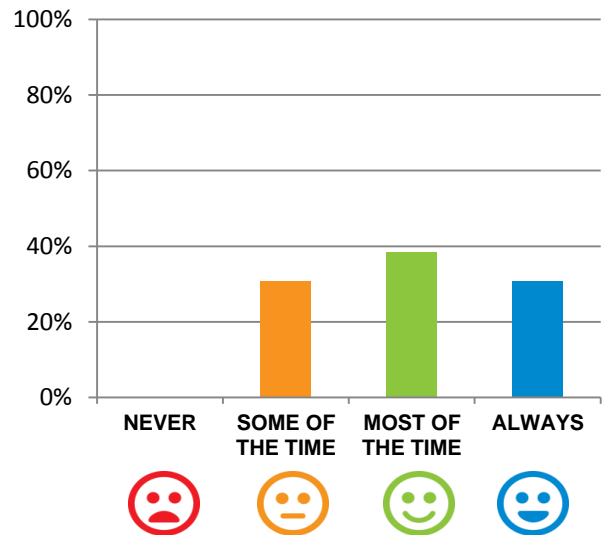
85% of responses were: most of the time or always

100% of responses were: most of the time or always

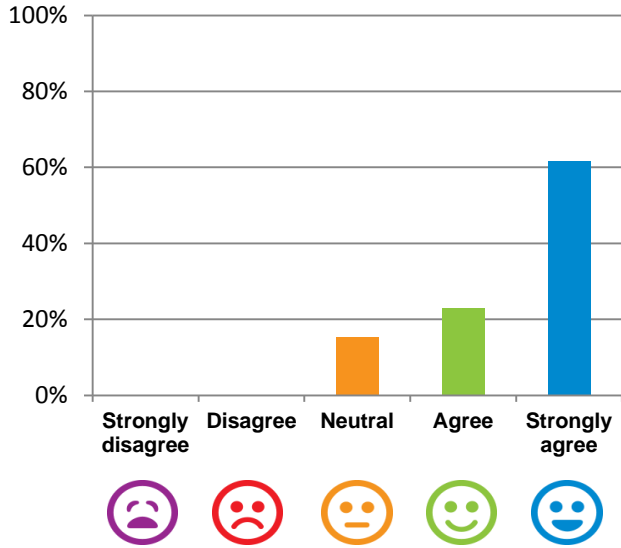
Do you like the food here?



69% of responses were: most of the time or always

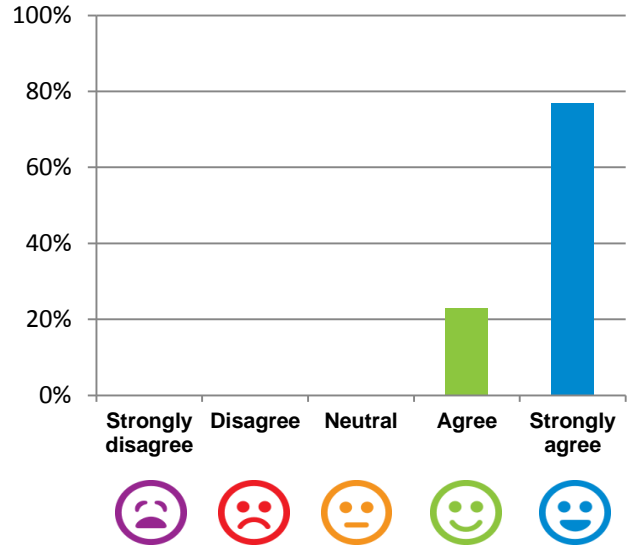
Do you agree with these statements?

If I'm feeling a bit sad or worried, there are staff here who I can talk to.



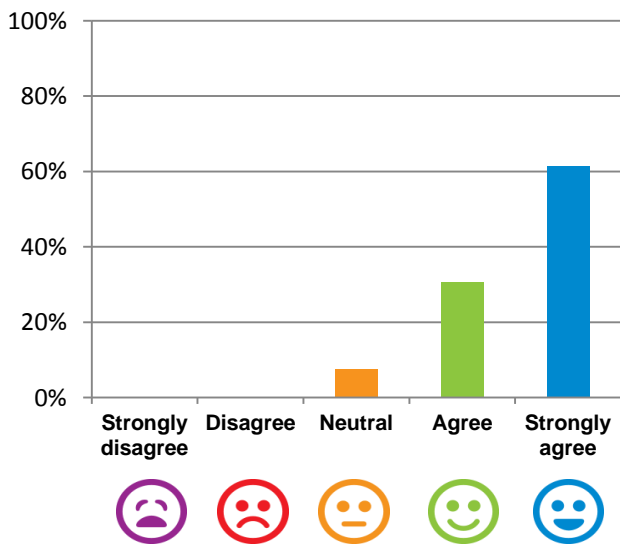
85% of responses were: agree or strongly agree

The staff know what they are doing.



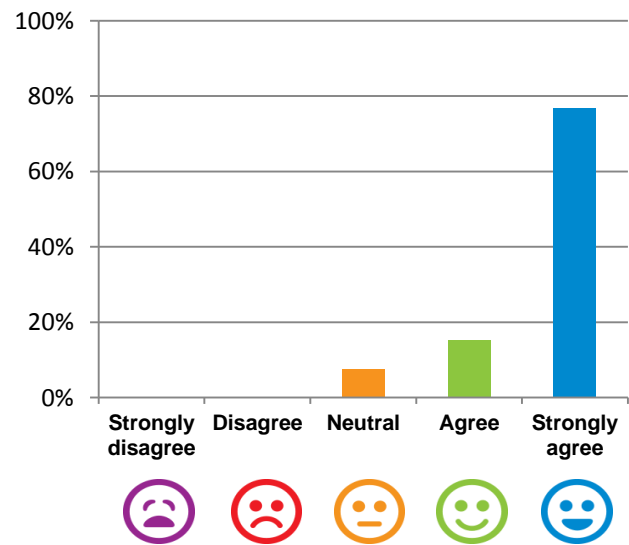
100% of responses were: agree or strongly agree
